**Both Majors **Bid your 5-card major*

Bidding: South uses 2C Landy to show both majors. With equal length in the majors, North bids 2D asking for partner's 5-card suit.

Play: West leads DQ. Declarer wins in dummy to lead a heart through East. After winning the HA, East leads a trump. Declarer finesses the SQ and proceeds to cross-trump diamonds & hearts.

Hand 2: DON'T showing bid suit plus one suit higher

**Clubs plus a higher suit **Pass or correct*

Bidding: South shows clubs plus a higher suit, 54 either way. North bids 2D asking partner to pass if diamonds is their 2nd suit or correct if not. South corrects to 2S.

Play: West leads the D2. East wins the DK and continues with a low diamond. Declarer trumps and counts the HCP. East must hold the HQ. Declarer finesses East for the HQ and cross-trumps diamonds and clubs for 10 tricks.

Hand 3 DON'T – double showing a single 6+ card suit

**Shows any 6+ card suit **Pass or correct*

Bidding: South bids 2C in case North's suit is clubs. This is known as pass or correct. If North held another suit, they would bid it.

Play: West leads the SA and switches to the DQ. Declarer should win in hand and lead the C9, running it when West plays low. A, running it when West plays low. And successful club finesse should be followed by the play of dummy's spade. 10 tricks

*Weak with a 6+ card suit **Forced*

Bidding: North opens 1NT, East overcalls 2S and South bids 2NT, Lebensohl. This shows 0-7 HCP and promises a 6+ card suit. North is forced to bid 3C and South corrects to their suit – 3D.

Play: West leads the SJ. Declarer wins the SA. Plays the CA and trumps a club. As East has shown long spades, the odds are the HQ belongs to West. Declarer should now run the HJ. Dummy wins the 2nd heart to trump another club – CJ now high. After drawing the final trump, declarer leads towards the DK and cashes the CJ. 10 tricks.
